

Welcome to the Rocky Creek Park Hiking Trail!

By talking one-on-one with visitors to Somerville Lake, Rangers found that Rocky Creek Park was in need of a hiking trail. In the Fall of 1999, construction began on this 3.2 mile trail. Almost a year later, it was opened to the public.

The Rocky Creek Park Hiking Trail provides excellent opportunities for viewing all kinds of plants and wildlife in a variety of communities. Everything from deer to Bald Eagles can be seen in this diverse landscape. Along the south loop during the winter, the creek may hold water and create habitat for a variety of waterfowl. To the north, keep a watchful eye out for deer feeding along the path.

For environmental and safety purposes, this trail is for foot traffic only. Please do not use bicycles or motorized vehicles along the trail. Remember: "Take only pictures and leave only footprints."

The Corps of Engineers would like to thank the many members of the Boy Scouts of America, the Girl Scouts of the USA and the Texas A&M Chapter of Alpha Phi Omega, for the time and hard work they put into building this trail.

This is a new trail. Trail maintenance is an on-going process. Please be careful along the trail. Watch for stumps or small holes along the trail that may have been accidentally overlooked during the construction.




